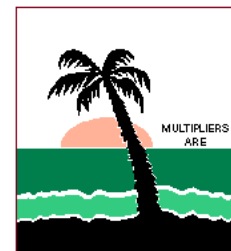

From the President's Corner

It's been a busy start for 2003, and with the FQP just days away, there's no sign of it letting up soon!



FCGers attended club meetings at the Miami, Orlando and Ft. Walton Beach hamfests, as well as at KE1F's. Overviews of each meeting can be found in this issue of the Gazette.

We will meet informally in mid-May at Dayton, with hopefully a sea of orange shirts dominating the landscape at Saturday evening's Contest Dinner!

In addition, FCGers have been very active heating up the airwaves. We made our presence well known in the NAQPs, January VHF Test, CQ 160s, NA Sprints, ARRL DX Tests, Russian DX Test, WPX SSB and the GAQP, as well as a few other miscellaneous contests. Claimed scores for many of these efforts can be found in subsequent pages.

Conditions were just perfect for us Floridians in the two March SSB Tests. It was amazing to see our distinct advantage on 10 during the day and on 20 pre-dawn be so pronounced. Unfortunately, the sunspots are declining so rapidly that both of those advantages are not likely to be there at all next year. Still, with almost 46M in the ARRL Tests, we are way ahead of last year and will be in the Unlimited Club category for the first time ever in this contest. Look out, PVRC, SOMC, FRC and YCCC!

It looks like we are way ahead of last year in WPX so far, too. WPX is such a fun format, being able to work everyone for credit now. Look at those terrific scores from T93M at FM5BH's using TO3M and from the multi crews at Team Whoop Ass, VP55W (will every VP5 expedition be sporting this prefix from now on??) and K9ES, who has really gone out of his way to contribute multi-op efforts in many contests this season to the FCG cause. I know WPX CW is on Memorial Day weekend, but please try to make an effort to support the FCG cause that weekend if you can. We finished 6th in the world last year as a club!

We've picked up a large crop of new members since our last Gazette! WB9IHH becomes the FCGer with the most consecutive dits! Despite that, you'll still find Jim primarily on CW. (Reminds me of the days when both K1SSH and

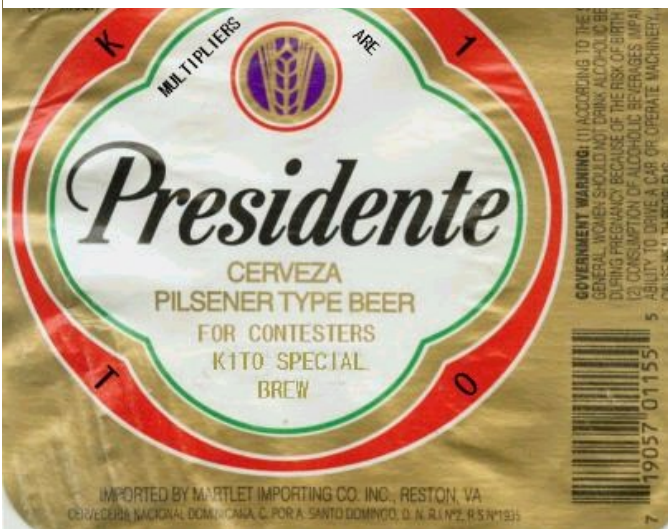

FCG Meeting Report

Orlando Hamcation Meeting attendees included the following:

Also spotted at the hamfest included K4XS, KG4WLH, K4VUD, K4FB, W4QM, N4JT, W3TMZ, WD4AHZ and W1ROX, W3AZD and WB3ANE

Dan, K1TO welcomed the attendees at the luncheon meeting at 11 AM at the Golden Corral restaurant. The meeting was scheduled early because the FCG presentation at the Hamcation was set for 1-3 PM. Scheduled for presentations were George, K5KG on his Dominica contest operations and the K5KG home station grounding system, and Frank NA4CW on information for beginning contesters. The WRTC-2002 video is also scheduled to be shown as time permits. Thanks to Bob, K4LW on coordinating with the Hamfest sponsoring organization for space/time for our presentations.

Dan reviewed some of the Club's more recent operating statistics:

- Our November SS operations, (dedicated to deceased member N4PK) ended up with 3M plus points, hopefully placing us in the # 2 club spot in the Medium Club category.

- In CQWW, the FCG broke into the 9-digit range (over 100M points) for the first time ever, and might end up as the top Medium club, although CQ does not stratify its club competition.

- The 10 Meter Contest wound up with 54 FCG entries, placing us in the Unlimited size category for the first time. Scores were up substantially over last year - from 19M to nearly 30M! Adding in the Panhandle and overseas entrants, well over 60 entries were active!

- January NAQP - FCG teams were fielded on both modes, making FL well represented yet again this time, despite no hanging Chads.

- FCG activity in the CQ 160 Meter Contest CW was way up over last year when we posted just 380K or so. Our claimed scores this time around are likely to exceed 1M.

Upcoming Meetings -

- There will be an FCG/FCG Panhandle meeting at the Fort Walton Beach Hamfest on Saturday, March 15th. Dan and Jim K4OJ both reiterated the FB hospitality shown them by the Panhandle members in past years at this event.

- Lou, KE1F has volunteered to hold a meeting at his QTH in April, date to be determined. This will be our first meeting in the Northeast area, so we look forward to some attendance from the Jax area members, as well as those on the mideast-northeast coast. Date/directions will be announced on the reflector when available.

Dan noted with sadness the loss of contesteer Jim Maxwell, W6CF, who died suddenly this past week. Jim was also the Pacific Division ARRL Director and well accomplished in the DX arena. Look for a number of NCCers and others to use the name "Jim", or even "Maxwell" in tonight's Sprint.

Also this past week Mark Obermann, AG9A's wife Cathy succumbed to cancer. Many operators in the SSB Sprint used the name Cat in remembrance and a number of the CW Sprint operators this evening are planning to do the same.

Dan reiterated the details of KU9C's recent offer to handle bulk shipment of QSLs to foreign bureaus for FCG members, at a price of one half the current ARRL rate. Ye scribe will be taking advantage of this with a shipment of QSLs to KU9C next week.

FQP 2002 scoring status - The plan to work with WT4I scoring software was unsuccessful, so the logs are having to be scored more manually as in previous years. There were 447 logs submitted, with over 60,000 QSOs. One mobile team made over 2000 contacts. Dan has completed the bulk of the cross checking and expects to finish the scoring work and write-up in several weeks.

Fred, K4LQ reported on Treasury statistics. 70 of a total of 127 dues paying members from last year have paid 2003 dues so far. Treasury contains \$929.15 A further \$440 has been collected for the W1CW Memorial Fund.

I attended part of the presentations by K5KG and NA4CW at the hamcation after the meeting. Both had some very good pictures in their presentations, and did a fine job with the material. Attendance was somewhat light, probably due to this being our first time presenting at this venue. Got some pictures of the presentation action, which will be in the next Gazette.

April FCG Meeting Report

Attendees included: AF2C, K1TO, K4LQ, KE1F, N2WB, NU4Y, W4AA, W4FDA and W4IX.

Prior to the start of the meeting we had a chance to visit Lou's shack and consumed our fair share of hot dogs and hamburgers while swapping contesting stories.

Dan began the meeting by thanking Lou and Anne for their hospitality and the opportunity to have our furthest northeast FCG meeting in 5 years.

Gleaned from the non-members during the round of introductions:

Jay AF2C is a Palm Coast neighbor of KE1F. He will be operating the upcoming FQP on phone. Jay is at the top of the DXCC Honor Roll with just a tribander at 50'.

Bill N2WB is an officer of the Florida Dxpediton Group. He recently participated in a humanitarian mission team in Northwest Haiti, operating HH4/N2WB when not working on mission projects. Also operating as part of the team were Team Leader Jan HH4/K4QD, Bill HH4/W4WX and Al, HH4/K3VN. Bill noted the Haitian mosquitos were the largest of any seen on any of his past dxpeditons. The next FDXPG dxpediton planned is to San Andres 20-28 October. They will operate a multi-two entry in the CQWW Phone Test, and have applied for the call 5J0X. Ops currently scheduled include W4WX, W1LR, K4QD, N2WB, W9AAZ, N5VL, N1WON and K9MDO.

Pres W4FDA has been licensed since 1937, and maintains a well equipped station at the former QTH of W4ZR (SK). Pres believes he is the longest licensed ham in the Northeast Florida area. He plans on joining us in FCG shortly.

Dan reviewed a couple trips that he has taken in recent weeks:

Trey Garlough, N5KO/HC8N visited Dan last week, his first visit to FL except for transiting the Miami airport about 70 times enroute to/from HC8N. Together they visited the W1YL/K4OJ, N4TO, K5KG, K4XS and WC4E QTHs. You may also recognize Trey as the developer of the Cabrillo log submission format.

Dan also took an extensive road trip that included visits with testers in Texas, Louisiana and Georgia. Highlights:

Houston - The Texas DX Society - W5ASP, K5WA, K5NZ, K5GN, K5GA, KM5M, KG5U, W5PR, station tour of W5KU, Rockets/Suns game to see Yao Ming

San Antonio - K5AF (ex KB8N) Paul uses minimal wire antennas, yet his pair of Omni 6s were skillfully guided to a #2 LP finish in one of the NA CW Sprints. Paul also went to the Air Force Academy with the coach of the Spurs, Greg Popovich, so we went underneath after the game with the Knicks to meet with Greg for a few minutes.

Austin - station tours of K5TR and N3BB/5. Both are very well appointed stations with large stacks and SO2R-ready consoles.

Dallas - lunch with N5TJ (Jeff was Dan's partner at the last 3 WRTC's) No station tours in the Dallas area, but did attend the Mavs/Spurs game which was thrilling and included a tribute to retiring star David Robinson.

Louisiana - W5WMU

Quite an array of towers and fixed antennas, not to mention the large amplifiers. Pat has donated an award for the 2003 FQP.

Georgia - lunch with K4BAI, tour of W8JI

Dan had sponsored FQP plaques that were won by W5WMU and K4BAI and had hoped to present them in person, but the timing was too aggressive for that to happen. The JI station is very impressive, with a 200' tower supporting a wire 4-square on 160 and a huge farm of Beverages, primarily sets of phased 800' Beverages in each of 9 directions!

An extensive discussion of last year's FQP was followed by Dan presenting certificates to our host Lou KE1F and also to Jim NU4Y and Fred K4LQ.

W5WMU plans a Multi-Multi Mobile effort in this year's FQP, operating with a young tester from his area.

All of the above just scratches the surface on what was a very lively and upbeat meeting/gathering. Thanks again, Lou and Anne!

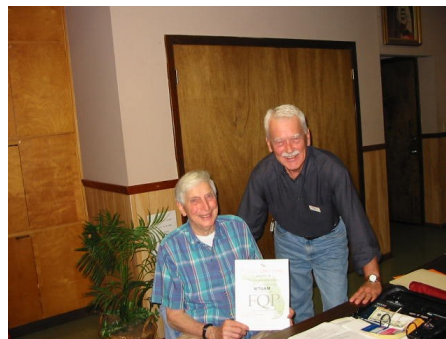
